have to (muset) – don't have to (nemuset) – funguje jako modální sloveso

Slovesné časy od *have to* se tvoří úplně stejně jako u běžných sloves

(**minulý**: I had to / I didn't have to, **budoucí**: I will have to/I won't have to, I am (not) going to have to,

předpřítomný: I have had to, she has had to..)

Většinou se nevyskytuje v průběhovém čase – I am having to – pokud ano, tak spíše hovorově.
